- Clients who have a normal screening mammogram but the radiologist is requesting a clinical consult for axillary lymphadenopathy, are reported in BIS in the "Report Program Screens" module on the "Tech. Asst." home screen.
- Select date range and appropriate site
- Click on client's name in the list that is generated
