Screening Mammogram: 2026 Mobile Schedule



What is a screening mammogram?

A screening mammogram is two X-ray pictures of each breast performed by a highly trained mammography technologist.

WHY ARE THEY IMPORTANT?

A screening mammogram looks for breast cancer in individuals who do not have breast symptoms. Screening mammograms can find breast cancer in its early stages, even before a lump can be felt. Anyone with symptoms such as a lump or new skin dimpling should see their health care provider immediately to determine if other testing is required.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible for a screening mammogram, you must:

- Be 40 years of age
- No new breast symptoms
- No breast implants
- No personal history of breast cancer
- Minimum one year since previous mammogram
- Resident of Canada with a valid provincial health card

HOW DO I BOOK ONE?

You can make the appointment yourself by calling the Nova Scotia Breast Screening Program (NSBSP). You do not need referral from a health care provider to book a screening mammogram.

WHERE DO I GO?

Mammograms can be done at one of our 11 fixed sites or 30 mobile stops across NS.

This year's mobile schedule is provided here or you can check nsbreastscreening.ca for a list of NSBSP permanent locations.

On the Day of Your Appointment:

- Bring your health card.
- Wear a 2 piece outfit with a top that buttons up the front. You will be asked to undress from the waist up.
- Do not use deodorant, powder, creams or lotions on the day of your appointment. These products may show up on the X-ray picture and make it harder to read your mammogram.
- **Be Breast Aware.** See your health care provider about any new breast symptoms even if you have recently had a normal mammogram.
